St. Agnes Academy, founded in 1851 by the Dominican Sisters of St. Catharine, Kentucky, is a Catholic independent, college preparatory school for girls. Located in East Memphis, St. Agnes Academy-St. Dominic School has a total enrollment of 916 students in pre-kindergarten through grade twelve, with an Upper School enrollment of 344. The School has been at the present site since 1951, and the campus has been expanded over the years. The Buckman Building was built in 1991 and serves as the campus center for science and mathematics. Siena Hall, which opened in 1999, houses the Davis Gymnasium, St. Catherine Chapel, the 300-seat Hook Theater, two art studios, a music room, dining hall and the School's administrative offices. The Veritas Research Center, completed in 2008, was built after years of research and study on technology integration upon gender specific learning styles. The Research Center houses a Cybrary, Tech Center, Mutli-Media Lab, a Distance Learning Center and eight classrooms. In August of 2010 the School opened the Davis Early Childhood Center, a state-of-the-art space which is focused on providing an exceptional teaching and learning environment for our youngest students. The parent body is composed of professional and managerial people, and a high percentage of parents are college graduates. With over one hundred and sixty years of tradition, the School actively encourages academic excellence and promotes spiritual and moral growth, social and ecological responsibility, leadership skills, multicultural awareness, artistic expression and physical fitness.

Faculty: There are 44 faculty members teaching in the upper school; 65% hold advanced degrees including 6 PhD's. The average teaching experience of the faculty is approximately 18 years. The student faculty ratio is 8:1.
