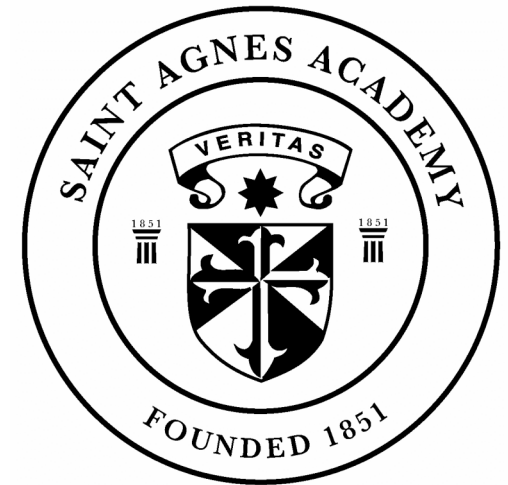

Drawing Studio

Policies & Procedures

Registration All forms must be mailed or submitted directly to the Siena Hall Administrative Office by Friday, May 7, 2010. A \$100.00 deposit is required with the registration form to hold your place in the course. The balance of all fees must be paid in full by Friday, June 4, 2010.

Withdrawal/Refund The last day to withdraw and receive a refund is also Friday, June 4, 2010. No refunds will be given after this date unless there is a case of critical illness or family emergency. Such situations will be handled on a case-by-case basis, and will only be considered if notification is received prior to the start of the specific program.

Cancellations/Adjustments Minimum and maximum numbers have been set for most programs. Every effort will be made to prevent cancellation of a class. Any schedule adjustments or cancellation will be announced at least one week prior to the start of the program.
