• SDS Wellness Survey Data


- From September to March, an average of 96.3 % of boys report they belong and feel included at St. Dominic School.

- 92.3 % of boys report they have a friend and/or group of friends at SDS they can count on no matter what.





• First Half Days of School

- o 8:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.
- First full day of school is **Monday**, **August 16**

Books and Supplies

- All books and supplies will be at school for your child on the first day of school
 - Includes textbooks, PE shirts (2), digital subscriptions, paper, binders, pencils, etc.
- o Parents pay the books and supplies fee on their FACTS account

• Meet-the-Teacher

- o Grade level Meet-the-Teacher meetings will be held at the beginning of the 21-22 school year
- Dates are TBA

Technology

- Teachers will assign iPads to students during the first half days of school
- o Grades 3-6 iPads have an attached keyboard

Homework

- Get outside and play--that does not mean more screen time
- Eat dinner with your family--and help with the setting and cleaning up
- Read just-right (Lexile appropriate) every night (school expectation is 20 minutes nightly)--and have your parents read to/with you
- 10-60 minutes of purposeful academic work (will vary upon grade level)
- Get a good night's sleep-research suggests/recommends boys at this age need 9-11 hours

Pedestal Food Services

- Access <u>MySchoolBucks</u> to add money to your child's dining account. Enter your child's name and birthdate to access their account. (After July 1)
- Monthly menus are posted on the Wednesday Wire
- We are a peanut safe campus.

Arrival

- Morning carline is from 7:30-8:00 a.m. and is located in the circular drive in front of the St. Dominic School off of Avon Rd.
- You can park at IPC and walk your son to the SDS school building

Dismissal

- o Dismissal is at 3:00 p.m. on M, T, TH, and F
- Early dismissal on W at 2:15 p.m. for faculty professional development
- Pickup is located in the circular drive in front of St. Dominic School (same as arrival)
- All Suns need to be picked up by 3:15 p.m. unless they are signed up for EDA
- You can park at IPC and walk to pick up your son
