



At St. Dominic School, we have created an academic environment that is challenging, but one that ensures every student has the attention and support necessary to rise to that challenge. We are home to a rigorous curriculum, innovative programs, extraordinary technology, and a commitment to help every boy achieve.

- We have implemented the nationally recognized Being a Writer program as a way to develop the writing skills that are so essential to future success. Developed by the Center for the Collaborative Classroom, this innovative program develops each student’s literary skills and nurtures a love of reading and writing.
- A 1:1 laptop school since 2002, we have also earned the distinction of Apple Distinguished School for over 10 consecutive years.

A 10:1 student-to-teacher ratio means that instruction is personalized, individual strengths are encouraged, and every boy has a chance to shine.

- In our state-of-the-art Distance Learning Center, students engage in virtual classroom experiences – “traveling” around the world, touring art museums and zoos, and tapping into the knowledge of experts across the globe.
- We were one of the first independent schools in the nation to install a Kitchen Community Learning Garden, a dynamic outdoor classroom for hands-on learning, as well as a productive edible garden.
- Our STEM curriculum teaches experimentation and design thinking, which teaches our boys that trying different approaches and solutions is an essential part of the learning process.
- Because studying a second language at an early age enhances brain development, all of our boys study Spanish, PK2 through the sixth grade.
