- Our new Center for Excellence Math and Science building opened for the 20242025 school year. This innovative space facilitates collaborative teaching and learning
 by bringing all math and science education under one roof. It provides space for
 emerging programming that will challenge and inspire students to learn by doing
 through experimental activities and real world scenarios allowing our students to think
 creatively and dream big.

St. Agnes students consistently score higher on the MAP Growth assessment test in every subject across every grade than both the national norm and also the norm for Catholic & Independent Schools.

- Every student at every age has strengths and weaknesses, and our purpose for giving the
 MAP Growth assessment is to use the results to help every student grow whether to help
 strengthen areas where there are gaps or to push high-achieving students needing additional
 enrichment to continue to grow in knowledge and understanding.
- In our state-of-the-art Distance Learning Center, St. Agnes girls engage in virtual classroom experiences "traveling" around the world, touring art museums and zoos, and tapping into the knowledge of experts across the globe.
- We were one of the first independent schools in the nation to install a Kitchen Community Learning Garden, a dynamic outdoor classroom for hands-on learning, as well as a productive edible garden.
- Because studying a second language at an early age enhances brain development, all of our girls study Spanish, PK2 through the eighth grade.
- A 10:1 student-to-teacher ratio means that instruction is personalized, individual strengths are encouraged, and every girl has a chance to shine.

St. Agnes girls learn what it means to live in community.



Learning to make a better world.


