St. Agnes Academy is a Catholic Independent school for girls, founded in 1851 to educate young women in a principle-based program designed to prepare them for advanced formal and personal studies while deepening their faith. Located in west Tennessee, St. Agnes seeks and enrolls students from Memphis, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Students are admitted through a comprehensive application process as well as an in-house placement test.

Academic Program

SAA Curriculum for the Class of 2026

St. Agnes offers 14 Advanced Placement (AP) courses, 23 Honors (H) courses, 3 Dual Enrollment (DE) language courses, and 3 Biomedical Science Program courses.

No 9th-grade AP courses were offered.

St. Agnes Academy's class schedule allows for a maximum of six Honors, DE, or AP courses per school year due to the yearly requirement of Theology and study hall.

Dual Enrollment is offered in English and Spanish courses.

St. Agnes Premier Programs

Community Service

100 service hours are required for graduation.

All students complete a **Path to Caritas Capstone Project**. This project offers our students the opportunity to explore injustices in our society, connect with local non-profit organizations, and apply their understanding of the Circle of Social Action: to see, judge, and act.

SAA's Fine Arts program celebrates self-expression and connects students to history, diverse culture, and their own imagination.

Calliope magazine is published entirely by SAA students. Student works in Calliope include several Columbia Scholastic Gold Circle Awards and Mid-South Scholastic Art Keys.

Theater Arts

Students perform at local soup kitchens, nursing homes, and special needs day programs. The awardwinning program boasts alumnae pursuing careers in theatre arts with a foundation in performance and production. Students gain organizational skills, time management, working together toward a common goal, tenacity, and empathy.

Students are recognized and awarded for their performances by the Orpheum High School Musical Theatre Awards (HSMTA) to celebrate their musical and theatrical achievements.

For the 2025-2026 school year, there are three student productions: Cobweb Dreams, The Butler Did It!, and Shrek the Musical.

Athletics


St. Agnes offers athletic opportunities for all students in grades JK-12. The Upper School participates in TSSAA Division II-AA.

- Students enrolled in AP courses are expected to sit for and/or submit a portfolio of the AP exam at the end of the course
- DE courses receive the H additional GPA points only
- Grades earned in the 8th Grade and/or previously attended high schools are not factored into the GPA calculation




