Here, boys develop a genuine enthusiasm for learning, actively engage with our rigorous curriculum, and accept responsibility for their individual growth. Embracing the spirit of boys and knowing how boys learn best, educators guide them to success through intentional opportunities that support each young man's distinct strengths and challenges.

We have implemented the nationally recognized Being a Writer program as a way to
develop the writing skills that are so essential to future success.
 Developed by the Center for the Collaborative Classroom, this
innovative program develops each student's literary skills and
nurtures a love of reading and writing.

 Our STEM curriculum teaches experimentation and design thinking, which teaches our boys that trying different approaches and solutions is an essential part of the learning process.

 Because studying a second language at an early age enhances brain development, all of our boys study Spanish, PK2 through the eighth grade.



St. Dominic School consistently scores higher on the MAP Growth assessment test in every subject across every grade than both the national norm and also the norm for Catholic & Independent Schools.

- Every student at every age has strengths and weaknesses, and our purpose for giving the
 MAP Growth assessment is to use the results to help every student grow whether to
 help strengthen areas where there are gaps or to push high-achieving students needing
 additional enrichment to continue to grow in knowledge and understanding.
- In our state-of-the-art Distance Learning Center, students engage in virtual classroom experiences "traveling" around the world, touring art museums and zoos, and tapping into the knowledge of experts across the globe.
- We were one of the first independent schools in the nation to install a Kitchen Community Learning Garden, a dynamic outdoor classroom for hands-on learning, as well as a productive edible garden.
- A 10:1 student-to-teacher ratio means that instruction is personalized, individual strengths are encouraged, and every boy has a chance to shine.
